

He asked the Parish Council to comment on a request for speed reduction from the moors into Ilsington Village. At present the 40mph limit ends at the cattle grid, Haytor. He also asked what the councils thoughts are of the proposed new road into Newton Abbot. At the moment TDC priority is the Jetty Marsh development.

Cllr Retallick thanked Cllr Christophers for the swift action in removing the asbestos which had been dumped along the lane from Bagtor to Halshanger. He also asked Cllr Christophers to include the responses that we have received with regard to the gravel pit. The clerk will forward relevant emails.

The Chairman mentioned that the gravel pit was broken into yet a crime number has not been logged and was confused why this had not been reported.

Cllr Christophers confirmed that there has been no costs for the rubbish collection at the site by TDC as the costs are forwarded to DCC he also confirmed that TDC are ahead of target for providing Traveller sites, however not for transits sites which is where this site falls. Pre-emptions injunctions were mentioned again but that has not been actioned.

18/120 Business Brought forward by the Chairman.

The chairman reminded the council of the Remembrance Sunday services and asked for representatives to attend both services. Cllr Retallick offered to lay the wreath at Ilsington church and the Chairman will go to Liverton football field to lay the wreath there.

18/121. Grant applications – to consider applications received.

The application details have been circulated to all the councillors, Cllr Retallick if the group would come and present the application to the council. It was agreed to invite the charity to the next meeting. Also the councillors felt that the offer included within the applications should go to all schools in the parish. (Blackpool School had not been listed).

18/122. Road warden/Lengthsman services – Report from working group.

Cllr Wills presented the report (*appendix 1*) to the meeting and asked the council to consider the action points on the report. Cllr Dunkley proposed that the council agree the report and the action points to go forward with this project Reeve seconded the proposal and all were in favour.

18/123 Planning

The chairman moved this item and the order for the benefit of the public attending the meeting

b) DNPA 0546/18 Proposed alterations and change of use to agricultural barns to form four tourism units and creation of glazed porch link to farm house kitchen door at Higher Sigford, Bickington. **NB. There were 2 applications to consider a listed building and full planning consent.** (*Cllr Wills suspended SO and asked the agent if the buildings if they could be used for the farm business*). *Standing Orders resumed. Cllr Retallick declined to comment on this application.*

Support – making good use of redundant buildings as a diversification to support the on-going sustainable business for this farm.

a) DNPA 0529/18 Proposed erection of 9m telegraph pole with associated cabinet at field north of Higher Knappa, Bickington - *Support to create better infrastructure within the rural country side.*

c) TDC 18/0175/FUL Proposed extension to form annexe at Ditchling, South Knighton Newton Abbot TQ12 6NP – *No objection*

18/124. Speed monitor camera units – To discuss purchasing units for the parish

The meeting agreed to discuss this again, the general feeling is that there may be support from the councillors to purchase this now. The clerk advised the meeting that any siting of cameras would need authorisation from the highways engineer. There are several locations within Liverton that the council would like to see speed reduced. Add to next month's meeting to agree, in the meantime contact highways about locations and the process of fixing it at those locations.

Cllr Dunkley offered to contact the 'community speed watch group' for further information.

18/125. To set a date for the Finance and standard committee to consider the Precept for 2019/2020.

18/126. Funding Opportunities –

The clerk informed the meeting of various funding schemes currently being offered and agree to share the information with the village halls including the workshop giving details of how ‘crowd funding works’.

18/127. To receive reports from Parish Councillors on outside bodies.

Cllr Retallick reported to the meeting that there has been some swaling on Haytor commons yesterday and today.

Cllr Dunkley reported 1. Liverton Village Hall’s Christmas Event is on the 2nd December.

2. He is currently reviewing the councils risk assessments

3. The bin at the Star Inn is temporary and being monitored as to how much use it gets, it is mainly full of dog waste and should be emptied weekly (Thursdays) at the moment it is unclear who is funding it.

4. 10 rubble bags have been dumped at the top of Staple Hill Road, he has reported it online as fly tipping.

The clerk confirmed that the directional signs for Ilsington Playing fields are ready to be fitted and recently confirmed the sizing of the text to the highways engineer.
