MINUTES OF THE MEETING

Cllr Wills welcomed everyone to the meeting

18/98 To accept apologies for absence.

Cllr Patch, Cllr R Steemson and Mr J Christophers

18/99 Declaration of interest in items on the agenda.

None declared.

18/100 Clerks report.

- the village sweeper has visited Liverton twice recently
- We have received a query from the auditors regarding the final figures, this has been dealt with. The problem was related to un-presented cheques being entered twice.
- ICO registration is due in November and the DD will be amended for the new charges
- Email from resident noting the vegetation being cut back at the Gypsy site. Circulated to all councillors
- Cllr Retallick enquired if the freedom of information request has been acknowledge, the clerk confirmed there is no more information at this time.

18/101 PUBLIC FORUM & MEMBERS COMMENTS – (limited to 10 minutes)

(Applicants with planning applications for consideration may also speak for up to 3minutes on behalf of their own application)

Cllr Bainbridge had witnessed a large vehicle struggling through the village again and asked if warning signs should be placed to stops these vehicles using the narrow lanes as this is not the first time it has happened. The councillors agreed that this happens fairly often. The highways engineer have already made a site visit and stated signs were not necessary. Cllr Retallick noted that in other parishes signs have been placed advising large HGV that the road may not be suitable for large vehicles and suggested this council may wish do something similar.

It was also noted that the large bins belonging to the pub are left at the side of the building which potentially restricts the width of the school road, Cllr Dale agreed to discuss this matter with the landlord.

Cllr Hember noted that she attended a meeting at the Great Planation and the plans may have an effect on the local highways.

Cllr Wills noted that several weeks ago he witnesses a workman at the gravel pit who was surveying the site for new gates on behave of DCC. The dumpy bags are back in the entrance of the gravel pit.

18/102. To confirm the minutes of the last meeting 24th July 2018

These were signed as a true record of the last meeting.

Ilsington Parish Council (Full Council meeting)

18/103. To receive reports from District, County Councillors, DNPA Ranger and Police.

Cllr Gribble confirmed that he has invited Ms Booth to come to this Council's meeting. He agreed to follow up the FOI request.

Cllr Gribble noted the comments about speeding through Liverton and offered to support the council if they wish to purchase speed restriction signs.

Cllr Retallick asked if DCC still undertake speed surveys. If so perhaps one should be taken before this council commits to purchasing a sign. Cllr Wills is concerned as recently a lorry turned over although it was not certain the cause was speeding. The councillors discussed flashing signs to slow the traffic – the speed limit is not the problem but the vehicles are not abiding by it.

Cllr Retallick asked Cllr Gribble to report that the hedges at Ramshorn Down and Lenda to Willis Cross both of which belongs to DCC are encroaching onto the highways and require cutting back.

18/104 Business Brought forward by the Chairman.

- a) Update on the footpaths in Liverton – Covered in previous item.
- b) Speeding through Liverton – Cllr Dunkley noted the council discussed the provision of a speed monitoring unit April in 2018 at a cost of approx£1800, the council declined to purchase it at that time. There are issues over storing the unit and setting it up. The clerk did contact DCC highways to loan a unit but this was not possible. A community speed watch scheme could be considered and may be investigated again.

The councillors agreed that speed signs do seem to work and asked for this item to be discussed again next month.

- c) Update from the DAAT project in Ilsington – both sites are live. While the contractors were at Ilsington digging the trench during August the opportunity to lay a cable which would provide electricity to the upper end of the field seemed like an opportunity too good to miss. It was agreed to go ahead and purchase the cable. The consumer unit needed to be updated in the pavilion. Quotes are now required to connect the cable to the consumer unit and a power post in the field. The Liverton column went in 2 weeks ago, again the club took the opportunity to lay trunking for an electric cable also to provide power in the middle of the field, the consumer unit also needed updating with in the club house.

18/105 Grant applications – to consider applications received

Withdrawn – The applications was for renovation of hand bells. The councillors believed this was a good project and disappointed the application was withdrawn as they would be keen to support the renovations with a view to offer them on loan to the local primary school.

18/106. Road warden/Lengthsman services – To consider this provision within Ilsington parish and to create a working party for the project.

Cllr Wills gave an overview of what types of services this could be provided within this parish. A working party was agreed and the members are Cllrs Will, Dale, Steemson, Prior and the clerk Mrs C Retallick. The first meeting will follow the planning committee meeting on Tuesday 9th October.

18/107. Gritter – To discuss and approve provision for a gritter and create a working group.

The clerk presented a report to the councillors to consider which included recommendations from other parishes. After a lengthy discussion the councillors agreed not to purchase any equipment at this time.

18/108. Millennium information board – to agree a new location

The councillors agreed that it should be sited within the lower car park at Haytor.

18/109. Planning

18/110. To receive reports from Parish Councillors on outside bodies.

Cllr Dunkley reported that Liverton Village Hall committee had met, also the BBQ launch was a successful event. He also noted that at the top of Benedict Road a new green rubbish bin bolted to a concrete slab has appeared, it has been dragged around to several locations and wondered if the parish had requested it and would the council be paying for it to be emptied? - The clerk will check with TDC and Cllr Christophers. Cllr Dunkley will monitor the situation.

Cllr Retallick noted that the DNPA Local Plan is out again for consultation, holiday homes are the main subject of discussion. The launch is on the 3rd of December with public drop in's being advertised locally. In January DNPA are running workshops for councillors and this is their opportunity to comment.

Cllr Wills reported that IPFARA have not met but the Chairman Mr P Smith has sent a report see attached (appendix 1). Cllr Wills will acknowledge receipt and ask when the hedges are due to be cut.
